What is Prosperity?

3 John 2 expresses a desire for believers to prosper and be in good health, just as their soul prospers. Prosperity is defined as a life flourishing in all areas—spiritually, economically, physically, relationally, and financially.

It reflects abundance, worth, and security in one's God-given identity. True prosperity involves fulfilling kingdom assignments, living with purpose, giving generously, and being a good steward. Jesus sacrificed His life so that we can live an abundant life. As believers, we have a responsibility to follow biblical principles to acquire it.

The Bible teaches that knowledge brings deliverance:

"Through knowledge shall the just be delivered." — Proverbs 11:0

Many people remain in poverty because of a lack of knowledge. As Hosea 4:6 says, "My people are destroyed for lack of knowledge." This includes a lack of understanding of biblical truths, principles, and their proper application. Renew your mind by reading and studying God's word.



Do you know what God says about your present and your future? Stop focusing on your current circumstances. Instead, focus on His Word and aligning your life with His truth:

- I am above only and not beneath!
- I am the lender, not the borrower!
- I will lend to nations!
- I am blessed to be a blessing!
- · Wealth and riches are in my house!
- I will be prosperous and have success!
- I will prosper and be in good health as my soul prospers!

Align your life with God's Word. Seek Him in areas that feel misaligned. Speak only what His Word declares over your life, and renounce any words spoken over you that do not align with His truth.







Everything comes from God—your body, families, homes, gifts, finances, and resources. You are the steward, not owner. God is the true administrator, and your responsibility is to manage His blessings with faithfulness. "Well done, good and faithful servant! You have been faithful over a little; I will put you in charge of many things." — Matthew 25:23 Can God trust you with what you have? Can He trust you with the people and resources He has placed in your life?



Your words have power:

"For as he thinks in his heart, so is he." — Proverbs 23:7

The Hebrew word for "heart" here refers to the soul, life, and self. What thoughts are shaping your identity? Scripture teaches that out of the abundance of the heart, the mouth speaks. Many times, your perspective is distorted because you speak negatively about yourself.

Change your circumstances by aligning your words with God's truth. Speak life, not death. Let God's Word reshape your present and future.

## On Discover Your Hidden Treasures

What unique gifts do you possess?

Take time to reflect:

Are you creative?

- Do people come to you for advice?
- Do you love cooking or baking?
- Do you have a passion for serving others? God has already placed something inside you to produce an increase.

Write down your passions, dreams, and talents.

Remember the parable of the talents (Matthew 25:14-30)—God expects you to use what He has given you. Do you truly know the gifts and talents God has placed inside you? God has already given you everything you need for life and godliness. Look at what He has placed in your hands—it is more than enough!

 What resources or abilities do I already have?

Take a moment to assess your current situation:

- What problems do I see around me?
- How can I be the solution?





God's kingdom operates on the principle of sowing and reaping:

"Give, and it shall be given unto you." — Luke 6:38 It will be multiplied back to you whether you sow financially, spiritually, or relationally. Give with a cheerful heart, not out of obligation, but with the right intent. God loves a cheerful giver!



Faith which is spiritual coupled with action brings our hopes into reality. In doing so, you trust in God's provision and timing.

"Faith without works is dead." — James 2:26

"According to your faith be it unto you." — Matthew 9:27-29

Faith requires both belief and action. Do not be discouraged when things don't happen on your timeline. If God said it, that settles it! Hold onto His promises and take steps toward what He has spoken.





Give generously, and you will reap abundantly.

"The generous will themselves be blessed, for they share their food with the poor." — Proverbs 22:9

Never be tight-fisted or stingy. Honor God with your time, talents, resources, and finances.

"Bring the whole tithe into the storehouse... See if I will not open the floodgates of heaven and pour out so much blessing." — Malachi 3:10

Giving is an act of trust. God doesn't need your money—He desires your obedience and faith in His provision. Nothing you offer is too small or big when given with the right heart.





Wisdom is essential for prosperity:

"Wisdom is the principal thing; therefore **get wisdom**: and with all thy getting **get understanding**." — Proverbs 4:7 Wisdom is a tree of life, bringing growth and stability. The ability to properly apply what you have learned is wise. Wisdom is more valuable than silver, gold, or material possessions.

Always seek the Lord for wisdom and surround yourself with those who offer wise counsel. Living a truly blessed life requires wisdom, understanding, and knowledge.

When Solomon asked for wisdom and understanding (2 Chronicles 1:11-12), God granted him wisdom and gave him riches, wealth, and honor—something no other king would have. This request showed Solomon's humility. Though he was a king with authority, he recognized his need for divine guidance. It takes humility to acknowledge what you lack and to ask for help. Solomon, despite his position, humbled himself before the King of kings.





As you read with Solomon, true wealth comes from God.
"The Lord your God gives you the ability to produce wealth."

- Deuteronomy 8:17-18

You don't have to chase wealth like the world does. The world's method of acquiring wealth often leads to compromise, stress, and endless striving. But Scripture says:

"The blessing of the Lord makes rich and adds no sorrow to it." — Proverbs 10:22

Wealth obtained through God's principles brings peace, purpose, and generational impact. True wealth is more than material possessions—it's a life of abundance, integrity, and legacy.



We must acknowledge and repent when we fall short of honoring God with what He has entrusted us. Whether finances, family, health, or resources.

"If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just to forgive us and cleanse us from all unrighteousness." — 1 John 1:9

Sometimes, we fall short due to a lack of wisdom. After repentance, seek God's guidance, obey His direction, and make changes in alignment with His will.






Your reputation is more valuable than riches.
